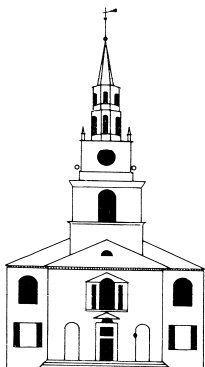

GOSPEL OF MARK ALIVE

We invite the community to join us on Sunday, March 14th, starting at 3:00 PM in the Sanctuary, for a storytelling performance of the Gospel of Mark by Rev. Bert Marshall. Some of you may know his name from Church World Service, as Bert is the Regional Director for the New England area. A native of Weeping Water, Nebraska, he has played professionally in a rock 'n roll band, and driven tractor-trailers for a New England health food distributor. He is a graduate of Yale Divinity School, and former pastor of the First Congregational Church in Lee, MA, from September 1997-October 2006. Come join us for this wonderfully entertaining and inspiring experience.

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

As the cover page of this month's Church Matters suggests, March 14th will be a memorable day for many members of the church and the wider community. At 3:00 that afternoon, Rev. Bert Marshall will perform the Gospel of Mark in our sanctuary. Those in attendance will experience Scripture in a new and unique way. That day, Bert will tell the Gospel *from memory* and with fitting flair. As a student of Shakespeare's work, I am ever impressed with the ways that players can turn words on a page into a living entity on a stage. As a student of the Bible, I look forward

to hearing and seeing Mark's Gospel enacted in Bert's "Gospel of Mark Alive."

In the light of that upcoming event, I want to offer a complementary path into the "living word" of Scripture. The day after Bert's performance, and for the following seven weeks or so, I will lead a group study of Mark's Gospel. No memorization required! The "Brown Bag Bible Study" group will meet on Monday afternoons from 12:00 -1:15 in Charter House. I realize that the timing of these gatherings will not agree with some of your schedules, but I hope that those of you who prefer a daytime class will be able to participate. (If there is interest, I may be able to offer an evening session of the "Brown Bag Bible Study" in the future. However, this first course will be an afternoon-only offering.)

The guiding objectives are clear. The sessions will allow us to plumb the depths of the words as recorded in the Gospel, to ask questions, and to think together about what that ancient text has to do with our lives. For some, these classes will be a continuation of previous study. For others, this will be their first entrance into Scripture. I trust the conversations that await us will be rich and accessible for all.

Frankly, I am excited about this adventure. I love to teach and have enjoyed leading many Bible Study courses over the years. With each new course of study, I am reminded how much more there is to discover.

On a final, logistical note, I would like to ask the participants to bring a Bible (any translation) and, if desired, something to eat. And, if I may, here is the first assignment: For March 15, please read the first chapter of Mark.

That day, I will cover some preliminary background information about the Gospel (authorship, likely date of text, original audience, important themes), then we will dive in. There is more in that opening chapter than we will have time to fully discuss, but I fully expect that we will be fed by the questions and insights shared.


Here are some ideas to start you on your way:

April 18th – Local Meat & Eggs

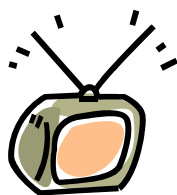
April 25th – Skills (making cheese & bread, canning, etc.)

Facilities Update



1. Fixit Thursday for the month of March is March 4, 2010 at 9:00 A.M. We will meet in Fellowship Hall. As usual, a list of chores will be provided. A careful inspection of all radiators in Charter House and Church will be made.
2. We now have a DVD copier; it makes one copy at a time and is a stand-alone unit. Copies of a service will be made on request.
3. As mentioned last month, significant air drafts (crawl space under the east end of the house, southwest corner of the Church office, and north wall of the pantry) were detected and fixed. The drafts in the crawl space have been essentially eliminated since we had found a significant hole in the foundation under the south porch. The flooring of the south porch will be replaced in the spring of 2010.
4. Work is progressing in examining the possible replacement of one of the two heating systems in Charter House. Background information is being collected so that a decision can be reached.

5. February has been a rather quiet month in terms of maintenance chores; this has freed time to continue the never-ending cleaning and thinning chores of the basement of Charter House, the boiler room in the Church, and the various closets in both buildings.
6. One of the next items to consider is the cleaning of the curtains on the Palladian windows
